Area of learning	Objectives to be covered
Communication and Language	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Connect one idea or action to another using a range of connectives. • Develop social phrases. • Use new vocabulary in different contexts. • Learn rhymes, poems and songs. • Engage in non-fiction books.
Personal, Social and Emotional Development	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Express their feelings and consider the feelings of others. • Identify and moderate their own feelings socially and emotionally.
Physical Development	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Progress towards a more fluent style of moving, with developing control and grace. • Develop their small motor skills so that they can use a range of tools competently, safely and confidently. Suggested tools: pencils for drawing and writing, paintbrushes, scissors, knives, forks and spoons. • Combine different movements with ease and fluency. • Further develop and refine a range of ball skills including: throwing, catching, kicking, passing, batting, and aiming. • Further develop the skills they need to manage the school day successfully: - lining up and queuing - mealtimes - personal hygiene
Literacy	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Read some letter groups that each represent one sound and say sounds for them. • Read a few common exception words matched to the school's phonic programme. • Form lower-case and capital letters correctly. • Spell words by identifying the sounds and then writing the sound with letter/s.
Maths	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Link the number symbol (numeral) with its cardinal number value. • Understand the 'one more than/one less than' relationship between consecutive numbers. • Compare length, weight and capacity
Understanding	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Draw information from a simple map. • Understand that some places are special to members of their community. •

the World	<p>Recognise that people have different beliefs and celebrate special times in different ways.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Recognise some environments that are different to the one in which they live.
Expressive Arts and Design	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Explore, use and refine a variety of artistic effects to express their ideas and feelings. • Watch and talk about dance and performance art, expressing their feelings and responses.

Focus for learning

- Finding out fire safety and who is a safe stranger.
- A range of religious and cultural celebrations including Bonfire Night, Remembrance, Diwali and Christmas.
 - Preparing for our Christmas Performance.
