As part of our inaugural newsletter I thought the first thing you would like to know is who we are – and what we do! As you would imagine, the Governing Body at Thorpe Hesley Primary School is newly formed – but that doesn't mean we are inexperienced!! Our members have been serving as Governors in either the Primary, Infant or Junior school from just a few months, up to more than two



decades!! Some of our children left a long time ago – but the impact the school had in their success means we continue to want to be a part of it. What impact do we have?

We recently identified that Boys writing was something we wanted to improve. It was placed on our Developing Excellence Plan, to ensure that attention was focused in this area, then Pat, our literacy governor, met with subject leaders from both buildings, to see how this would be addressed and to ensure consistency. She reported back at a meeting to let us know about efforts in this area and improvements to date.

Other Governor visits this term have been Sam Sukumar looking at Health and Safety, and Tracy Barker looking at Special Educational Needs. Parents are welcome to view Governor Reports, or minutes from our meetings, should you wish to do so.

Our effectiveness...

Recently, schools in Rotherham were given an effectiveness rating by the Local Authority, following consideration of Ofsted visits, minutes from Governing Body meetings, and other information. We were awarded the rating of an autonomous, consistently improving governing body – the highest level! This is very unusual and we are proud of our achievement!

More about Governance

All schools have a Governing Body. This is made up of Local Authority Governors, Parent Governors, Elected Governors, Staff Governors and Community Governors.

You do not need to have children in school to be a Governor. The role of the Governor is to be a 'critical friend' to the school – to help set school strategies, monitor the performance of the school and its leaders, and to help ensure that the school has the necessary resources and skill set.

Becoming a Governor gives you a chance to develop lots of skills – such as financial management, project management, and becoming involved in recruitments.

The most important role of a Governing Body is to appoint the Headteacher – something we think we did very well recently!!

Disadvantaged Funding...

You will have seen in the newsletter that we are asking all parents whose children are eligible for disadvantaged (formerly pupil premium funding) to come forward. This is a valuable resource to the school and registering (if eligible) ensures £1300 per child for six years to provide extra support. Some schools in our area attract this payment for over 50% of their pupils. This has a huge impact on the school as the money can be used in a variety of ways to support the children. If you are receiving benefits and think your child may be entitled to this funding please speak to our office staff.
