It has been another busy term in school, and we have had to contend with the absence of lots of our teaching staff due to various illnesses and ailments. We are pleased that everyone is better now and our students have, while missing their teachers, continued to enjoy their learning – testament to the leadership team for their contingency planning, and to the staff who have covered!!

As governors, we are aware that some parents supported a strike where they kept their child at home for a day, in protest against SATs. We can reassure parents that the way SATs and other testing is delivered in school is monitored very closely, and our leadership team ensure that testing is discreet, focused and aimed at getting the best out of children. We know we are very lucky at Thorpe Hesley Primary School to have fabulous teachers across the board, but we felt that a special mention should go, deservedly, to Mr Hanson and Mr Parkin.

Did you know that both teachers give up large amounts of their free time to allow our children to compete in activities after school and at weekends? Just this academic year our students have won awards in Football, Athletics, Cross Country and Rounders. Most recently Thorpe Hesley won 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> place in the Tennis Championships at Winterhill School and finished 4<sup>th</sup> overall in Rotherham!

Both teachers participate in a football league after school and are involved in football competitions at the weekend. The school team has won a range of tournaments, including representing Rotherham United and South Yorkshire at national events. The teachers have also coached our athletics team to become Rotherham champions and competed at the South Yorkshire games.

This all helps to make our children the well rounded, happy individuals that they are. We thank all the teachers for going 'over and above' to ensure that the children are happy, engaged and enjoying their education.

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This term saw the retirement of a long-standing and much treasured member of staff. Mrs Green retired in April after 36 years teaching! Her leaving assembly was amazing - all the staff made it special with comfy chairs and her favourite tea, each year group shared special memories which were presented in a presentation folder, and all classes rehearsed a song and presented to more than a few tears!! Each class had sewn a pattern which was added onto cushion covers for her to remember us by. Then afterwards, in the playground, all children performed a dance to "I love to boogie!"

It was testament to how much Mrs Green is loved that it took her over two hours to open all the cards and presents! In return, Mrs Green made the really thoughtful gesture of gifting the school with 1,000 daffodil bulbs, one for every child she has taught in the Thorpe Hesley Schools. She was a valued member of our community - attracting praise from Rotherham schools and beyond for her ideas in Foundation education. We will miss her but wish her the best of retirements!

My name is Sarah Scott and I have been a parent governor for the last 2 years. I have lived in Thorpe Hesley all my life and have fond memories of being a pupil at both the Infants and Juniors, just as Mrs Green was in the early stage of her career! I now work as a solicitor specialising in Family Law and was keen to be able to use some of my skills and experience through my work to support yet challenge the school to help to make sure it remains the best school in Rotherham. Recently I have taken on the role of Governor responsible for Special Educational Needs and Disability as well as Pupil Premium and Looked After Children. These roles involve meeting with the SENCO co-ordinators in school on a regular basis to assess whether school's systems, policies and budgets for SEND provision are successfully meeting the needs of our pupils with additional needs.

In June 2011 I became a parent governor at Thorpe Hesley Infant School. My knowledge of what a governor did and how they were involved in school was limited. But through the help and advice from the staff and other governors, I soon felt part of the team and ready for a challenge. My role as parent governor was the KS1 Literacy governor and to also attend the children centre meetings. I made various visits to school as part of this role, but I also volunteered in school in the foundation unit and in class 3.

In November 2013 I also became a parent governor at Thorpe Hesley Junior School — I really enjoyed being a governor for both the Infant and Junior Schools. During May 2014 I became the Vice Chair of Governors for the Infant building and also worked part time in the school office doing secretarial duties. As I was a governor for both the Infant and Junior Schools, I assisted others successfully joining both schools together to become Thorpe Hesley Primary School and appointing Mrs Toms as our fantastic Head Teacher.

In September 2014, I successfully became a teaching assistant at THPS, I work each morning in class 4 and in the afternoon I undertake SEN (Special Educational Needs) interventions.
