

This half term is even busier in the run up to Christmas with plays, carol singing, Christmas jumper day, the pantomime and Christmas lunch.

The governors have been undertaking lots of training recently. We are expecting a visit from Ofsted in the near future, so some governors have attended training specifically about this, plus Sarah Scott is busy upskilling in her roles as pupil premium and vulnerable children governor.

The government is putting more focus on the role of governing bodies, and now an Ofsted inspection will highlight bodies which it finds to be ineffective. We are very lucky to have a proactive team of people who genuinely want to support the school. Our governing body is now down to 13 members, including associates, consisting of staff, parent, community and Authority Local governors. Often governing bodies need to recruit throughout the year, but the legacy of our body was that governors stayed on from both the infant and the junior schools, so we had a very large team of over 20. This term we have said goodbye to Jackie Davies, who has been a governor at this school and before that the junior school, for over 20 years, to Helen Whitworth, and to Claire Chappell, both of whom were with us for a number of years. We will miss them all and wish them well.

New Vice-Chair!

At our last meeting, the role of Vice-Chair was up for election. Andrew Sowerby, who has many years' experience both as Chair and Vice-Chair, stays on, but is joined by Emma Crarer, who was an infant school Governor before the merge.

They will share the role which brings additional experience and resource.

Andrew's children have already been through school, Emma has Alena in Y5.

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Visits this term...

Lots of visits have happened this term. Kerry Hattersley has met with Mrs Toms to look at Equality and Safeguarding in school. Lots of work is going on behind the scenes, in particular in relation to making the curriculum as fun and engaging as it can be for all children. Sarah Scott continued her visits to look at pupil premium and vulnerable children, supporting this with custom training, She has also met with staff regarding SEND. I first became a governor several years ago when my three girls were pupils at the school.

At that time I helped in school on a voluntary basis as I wanted to be involved in the education of my children.

I had previously worked within both education and social care, and as I wished to spend as much time as possible with my own young family, I trained and worked as a child minder. I was able to begin working in school as a lunchtime play leader while still child minding.

Since those days, my role in school has changed from lunchtime supervisor, to part time teaching assistant and more recently to full time HLTA.

My role in the governing body has changed too. Initially I was a Parent Governor, but that changed when I became a full time member of staff. I am now an Associate Governor. This means that I do not have the power to vote at the termly full Governor meetings, only at the Committee meetings that I am a member of. As I still had children in school at that point, I wanted to continue as a member of the Governing Body to better understand the needs of the school and to support wherever I am able.

Although all my girls have left our school, I remain a member of the Governing Body. I feel that the better understanding I have of the current needs, aims and objectives of our school, the better I shall be at my job.

One of the ways in which I supported other staff and Governors during recent months was to help in the work and preparation for our school's Primary Quality Science Mark where we gained a silver award. This gave me a real sense of achievement and an opportunity to work with several members of our team.

My job in school, working with your children in Key Stage 2, provides me with a genuine feeling of pride and enjoyment. I look forward to any future challenges with enthusiasm.

Change to Governors' Awards

At a meeting last term, we discussed the Governor Awards and the process. Previously, staff in school have nominated children, then a panel from the governing body has assessed the nominations in line with our policy, (which as governors is one of our favourite roles)! On reflection, we felt that this approach could lead to bias where some nominations have more evidence than others. We reflected that being nominated at all was a fantastic achievement, and that these children should be rewarded consistently. We therefore agreed to amend the process to all nominated children being winners! Congratulation to all our winners below!!
